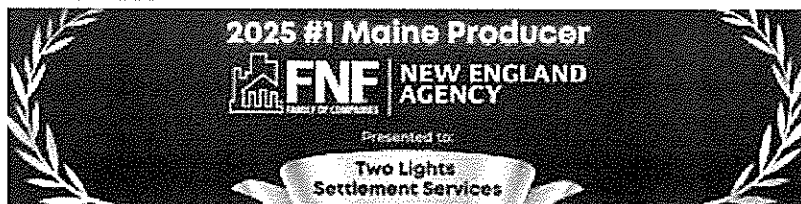

MMA's member municipalities have made their nominations for the 2026-2028 Legislative Policy Committee (LPC). It is now time to elect your representatives to serve on the committee. The enclosed election ballot must be completed by the Selectboard or Town/City Council of your municipality.

Number of votes

Most municipalities are being asked to vote for two candidates, because there are two elected LPC members for most districts. Some municipalities only vote for one candidate, because the other LPC member in that district is appointed. ***You are instructed on the ballot (above the list of candidates) whether to vote for two candidates or just one.***

Candidate profiles

If you are not familiar with any of the candidates, please review the Candidate Profiles on the back of the ballot. Also, feel free to contact the candidates directly.

Write-in candidates

In addition to the candidates listed on the ballot, you may vote for a candidate whose name is not on the ballot by writing that person's name in. The write-in candidate need not be from your municipality but must be an elected or appointed official from an MMA member municipality in your Senate/LPC District. ***Check to be sure the write-in candidate is willing to serve if elected!*** Write-in candidates should be communicating their interest in serving among the municipal officers within their district.

If you are instructed to vote for two candidates and only one candidate is on the ballot, please use the "write-in" line for your second vote if you know of someone who is willing to serve.

Candidate Profile:

Elaine Aloes has served on the selectboard of the Town of Solon for 33 years, the past 29 years as Selectboard Chair, also serving as assessor and overseer of the poor. She has served on the Somerset County Budget Committee since 2000 and is the President of the Somerset County Municipal Association. Elaine has also served on MMA's Executive Committee, including a term as president. Prior MMA service includes serving on the Strategic Planning Committee and on MMA's Workers Comp. and Property and Casualty Boards. She has served on the LPC since 2000, including a year as Chair. Ever the champion of rural towns, while serving on the LPC Elaine was appointed to a special rural/service center subcommittee. She would like to continue her service on the LPC to be a voice for the rural towns in Maine, ensuring that they are well represented. Elaine is most concerned about the tax burden placed on citizens and the impact of regulations on towns.

Erica LaCroix has served as town manager in Farmington for the past two and a half years and prior municipal and county experience dates back 30 years, having served as manager in the Town of Winslow from 2020-2023, Chief of Administration at the Chesterfield County (VA) Sheriff's office from 2014-2018, and with the City of Lansing, MI public service department from 1995-2013, with the last 10 years as senior administrator of operations and maintenance. Erica has also served on the professional development committee for the Maine Town, City and County Managers' Association, is Chair of the Western Maine Manager's Association, Secretary of the Maine Service Centers Coalition and serves on the AVGOG Executive Committee. She is a current Trustee of the Maine Municipal Employees Health Trust and has served as LPC Alternate for this past term. Erica would like to continue to serve on the LPC because she is concerned with the property tax burden and would like to work on property tax relief. Her biggest concern is that in the recent past, the Legislature has steadily added requirements and responsibilities on the local level, increasing local and county budgets, thereby putting more pressure on the property tax.
